A Classical Christian School

Paideia Academy is an instrument to assist parents in carrying out the biblical mandate to bring up their children in the paideia (training and admonition) of the Lord. We employ the Western classical tradition of learning, rooted in a distinctly Christian worldview, to cultivate godly affections and wisdom in our students in order to graduate virtuous men and women, whose love of Christ advances the Kingdom of God.

Core Omnibus Program: Students in grades 7-12 are provided a historically substantive and rigorous liberal arts education that draws deeply from the history and culture of Western Civilization. They are Socratically led in the study of the Great Books, consisting of two cycles through the ancient, medieval, and modern time periods.

Ancient Languages: Latin 3rd-10th grades, New Testament Greek 11th-12th grades.

HONORS AND CLASS RANK

Omnibus classes are considered honors classes due to the rigorous course expectations including the reading of primary sources. Honors courses receive an additional 0.5 quality point. Juniors and Seniors have the option to complete several dual enrollment classes. These courses receive an additional 1.0 quality point.

Class sizes are small, with a faculty to student ratio of 1:12. Therefore class rank is not meaningful outside of our institution.

JUNIOR RESEARCH • SENIOR THESIS

Junior Research Paper: Junior year students choose three fields of interest, and explore the philosophical and historical foundations of those fields. This research culminates in three 8-10 page papers. Finally, students create an oral and visual presentation based on their research.

Senior Thesis/Project: Students work with mentors and choose between two options for this capstone class: writing an apologetics thesis or completing a project which innovates or expands their field of study. The project also requires them to accumulate at least 25 hours of work experience in their chosen field. Both of these culminate in a 30 minute oral and visual presentation.
